FRENCH CERTIFICATION EXAMINATIONS

The French certification examination; DELF (Diplome d'Etudes des Langues Francaise) for secondary schools come up on the 5th and 6th June 2017 at Alliance Française in Iyaganku, Ibadan.

Parents who would want their children to register for this French examination should pay the examination fee of N7000= to the accounts department. Our French department will prepare the students for this examination.

YEAR 7 EXCURSION TO IITA

Our Year 7 students will be going on an excursion to the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA) in Ibadan between Friday 9th – Sunday 11th June 2017. The weekend trip will cost N40,000 per student.

RUBIKS CUBE

Students are encouraged to get the Rubik's Cube procured by the school from the Mathematical Centre in Abuja at N1,500 as they are the cubes that will be used at all National Competitions with the added advantage of helping the development of both sides of their brain (right and left) especially in psychomotor skills. Get yours in school before stocks run out.

ANDROIDS

The Android tablet is a fundamental tool for E-learning at CAIC but unfortunately, the number of students who have paid to the school account for the Android tablet is still far below the required number needed to place a new order with the supplier. The minimum order quantity that must be placed before shipment can be made is 50.

Regretably also, the fall in the value of the naira has affected the cost price of the androids and the supplier is no longer able to supply the androids to the school at the price of N40,000.

The new cost price is N45,000

The 2 possible options open to the school at this time are:

1. Parents who have already paid make an additional payment of N5,000 and more parents place new orders so that the necessary order number is achieved for an order to be placed and delivered.
2. Funds paid by the few parents can be refunded back to them if they are unable to wait for more students to pay for the tablet so as to meet up with the order quantity.

YEAR 7 LITERATURE IN ENGLISH

NOTICE TO BOARDERS

All male students in the boarding house are required to bring their hair clippers with them to the hostel on resumption.

Parents should please take note and ensure compliance as all male students will need a hair cut in the course of the term to ensure that they are always well groomed.

We appreciate the cooperation of parents in ensuring 100% compliance regarding keeping the hair low and well groomed.

We implore our parents to remind their children as they come back from the Easter holiday that the following rules and regulations must be adhered to strictly:

- 1. The male students' hair must be well groomed and low. No student will be allowed into the school with bushy hair.**
- 2. Female students must wear black coloured braids. Wool braids are not allowed. Braids MUST be shoulder length. Failure to adhere to this policy attracts cutting of the braids to the recommended length.**
- 3. Tie sagging is prohibited. The total school uniform must be worn with dignity and pride. School shirts that are no longer white MUST not be worn to school. Faded or slim fitted school trousers MUST not be worn to school. If your child needs a new set of uniform, please contact the Senior Administrative Officer.**
- 4. Students MUST not wear eye glasses that have coloured frames to school. The acceptable coloured frame for glasses in school is black or dark brown.**
- 5. Earrings must be studs with diamantes. Colored studs are not acceptable.**
- 6. The School Blazer is an integral part of the school uniform. It must be worn everyday with dignity. The School blazer sleeves MUST not be rolled up when worn.**
- 7. Phones are not allowed in the school premises. If a student is caught, such phone will be confiscated.**
- 8. It is mandatory as Christ Ambassadors to maintain decorum and respect for adults and colleagues at all times. This is a school ethic we hold highly.**
- 9. Wrist bands and colored wrist watches must not be worn with the school uniform. Wrist watches allowed are: black, brown, simple gold or silver.**
- 10. Only black or white hair bands/ruffles must be used by the female students to pack their hair.**

Please note that defaulters will face the consequences.
